The Patrick Trust

- ▶ Grants are available for UK registered charities undertaking general charitable projects in Birmingham, Coventry, Warwickshire, Worcestershire or Cornwall. Funding is at the discretion of the Trustees. Although previous grants have ranged from £500 to £25,000, most grants will be in the £1,000 to £5,000 range.
- ▶ **Eligible Expenditure**

The Trust will consider funding for projects that address the following areas:

General charitable purposes, Education and training, Disability, Prevention or relief of poverty, Arts, culture, heritage, Science, Other charitable purposes, Children and young people, Elderly and older people

- ▶ **Application Procedure**

Hays Travel Foundation

- ▶ Hays Travel Foundation was set up in 2015 by Hays Travel, the UK's largest independent travel agent, with 180 branches, to support charitable causes which help people achieve their potential. The funding is intended for local groups which operate or have an impact in an area in which Hays Travel have a branch and whose project helps young people up to 25 years of age develop in at least one of these areas: education, prevention of poverty, health, arts, culture or sports. Applications can be made at any time with a response normally given within a week. Funding is at the discretion of the Trustees. Grants tend to range between £3,000 and £15,000, but larger grants of up to £30,000 have previously been given

- ▶ **Key Criteria**

Registered charities operating in areas where Hays Travel have a branch may apply. To be eligible, organisations must be working to help young people (up to 25 years) in at least one of the following areas: Education, Prevention of poverty, Health, Arts and culture and Sports. Charities which are not located in an area where Hays Travel operate must be able to provide evidence of how the proposed project impacts a community in which they do. A list of all Hays Travel branches can be found on the Hays Travel website.

- ▶ **Eligible Expenditure**, Eligible projects should meet at least one of the Foundation's following objectives:
 - ▶ To support young people from disadvantaged backgrounds to allow them to pursue their educational goals.
 - ▶ To support young people living in, or at risk of, poverty, to help them develop and succeed.
 - ▶ To improve wellbeing and quality for young people with mental and physical health conditions (eg, providing equipment or experiences).
 - ▶ To create opportunities for young people to be able to enjoy, engage and participate in culture and the arts regardless of their economic background.
 - ▶ To encourage young people to get involved with sport as a way of enhancing wellbeing, through participation and progression at all levels. An online application form can be found on the Foundation's website.

Elmgrant Trust

- ▶ The Elmgrant Trust offers grants to voluntary and community organisations in the South West of England. The funding is intended to support projects that encourage local life, especially through education, the arts and social sciences. Applications can be made at any time. The board of trustees meet three times a year, in February, June and October. Applications need to be submitted one clear month prior to the meeting date. Organisations working in the South West of England are eligible to apply. Priority will be given to groups in Devon and Cornwall. Applications from recipients of grants are **not** considered again within a two-year period of the award being made. The Trust does not usually make grants to large UK wide charities, but make rare exceptions when an individual project is in the geographical area. Core running costs or project costs of small established organisations. **FUNDING IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE TRUSTEES**
- ▶ Funding is available for the following:
 - ▶ Projects which help to improve the quality of local life and welfare. Art projects which help to improve the quality of local life.
 - ▶ Match funding may be required.
 - ▶ **Application Procedure**
 - ▶ Applications should be made in writing and should include the following: Full contact details including registered charity number if applicable.
 - ▶ A summary of the organisation and what it does; including who it benefits. Two examples of previous projects over the last two years that have made the group proud and why. Reports from previous projects, including feedback and letters of support. A copy of the group's most recent accounts, or full budget. What a grant will be used for. What amount of funding is needed. Applications need to be posted; the Trust does not accept emailed applications. Contact the Elmgrant Trust for further information.

Joyce Fletcher Charitable Trust Grant

- ▶ The Joyce Fletcher Charitable Trust Grant is available to charitable institutions and organisations involved in music in a social or therapeutic context. In particular, the scheme wishes to support projects in the UK, and particularly the South West of England, with the following themes: Music in a social or therapeutic context, Music and special needs, Children and young people's welfare, preferably for arts activities.
- ▶ Applications are by letter and must be received by 1 November each year but preferably in September, especially when applicants are new. Maximum value of the grant is £2000 and minimum is £1000. **Application Deadline: 1st November 2020**
- ▶ Funding is not available for the following:
 - ▶ Individuals or students. Areas which are the responsibility of statutory funding. Purely professional music/arts promotions. Medical research.
 - ▶ There is no application form. Applications should be made in writing and should include the following:
 - ▶ The purpose of the grant. An indication of the history and viability of the organisation. A summary of accounts. A stamped, addressed envelope, or email address if a response is required. Contact the Joyce Fletcher Charitable Trust or visit the Trust's website for further information.

Leonard Laity Stoate Charitable Trust

- ▶ The Leonard Laity Stoate Charitable Trust offers grants to charitable organisations in England and Wales with priority shown to the South West of England. The funding is intended to support a range of charitable purposes. In particular, the Trust wishes to support projects with the following themes:
- ▶ Medical welfare and disability.
- ▶ Children and young people.
- ▶ The disadvantaged.
- ▶ Community projects.
- ▶ Strong preference is given to organisations that are registered as charities in England and Wales, or are exempt from registration such as established churches. Other applicants must be small scale, show a clear charitable purpose, be properly constituted as a non-profit making body, and be operated entirely on a voluntary basis. Although applications will be considered from eligible organisations based in England and Wales, the Trust has a clear preference for West of England, in particular Somerset (especially West Somerset), Bristol, Cornwall, Dorset and Devon. Regarding applications for Methodist causes, additional preference is given to the area included within Bristol Methodist District (incorporating Gloucestershire and Wiltshire north of Salisbury). Please note that the further applicants are from the Trust's core area, the less likely they are to be successful.
- ▶ **Eligible Expenditure**
- ▶ Small innovatory projects with a good measure of self-help or voluntary input are preferred. The broad categories supported by the Trust in order of preference are as follows: The disadvantaged. Medical and disablement. Methodism in the specified counties (the area included within Bristol Methodist District for applications for Methodist causes. The District incorporates Gloucestershire and Wiltshire north of Salisbury.) Youth and children. Other churches. Community projects. The environment. **Grants range from £100-£2000.**
- ▶ **Restrictions**
- ▶ The following are ineligible for funding: Individuals (unless supported by a registered charity). Institutions that are not registered charities or established churches that pay wages or other remuneration. (This will rule out most Community Interest Companies) Large projects (over £500,000 or with more than £250,000 still to raise). General appeals by national charities. Running expenses of a charity are not normally covered.
- ▶ **Application Procedure**
- ▶ The application process is ongoing and interested applicants may apply at any time. However, the majority of applications are decided at biannual Trustee meetings held in April/May and October/November each year. Therefore, the Trust recommends December to February and June to August as the best times to submit applications.
- ▶ Applications should be made in writing. Email and telephone applications will not be accepted.

Cornwall Councilor Community Chest Grant

- ▶ Each year, Cornwall Council puts aside a certain amount of money from its budget to ensure that the valuable work of voluntary and community groups is supported. Each of the 123 Cornwall Councillors are allocated a share of this money, which they are then able to award to worthwhile and beneficial community projects in their local area.
- ▶ The funding is intended to support a wide range of groups and activities, including projects such as
 - ▶ Helping vulnerable children or adults.
 - ▶ Helping young people.
 - ▶ Providing facilities for older people.
 - ▶ Supporting community facilities.
 - ▶ Supporting local environment projects.
 - ▶ Helping to tackle community safety issues.
- ▶ **Grants of between £100 and £1,000 are available. Applications for £100 - £500 are particularly welcomed, and 100% of project costs can be funded to this amount. Applications over £500 can only cover 75% of the project costs.**
- ▶ Applicants are advised to read the guidelines in full to ensure their project meets the criteria. Applicants should then contact their local Cornwall Councillor to ascertain whether there is funding still available and whether they are willing to support the proposal in principle. Should the proposal be viable, an application form will then be provided. Full details of all local Communities Support Assistants can be found on the Cornwall Council's website. Norman Family Charitable Trust

- ▶ Funding is at the discretion of the Trustees. The majority of grants awarded by the Trust are between £500 and £1,000, although grants of up to £5,000 will be considered. The Norman Family Charitable Trust was set up in 1979, and funds good causes in Devon, Cornwall and parts of Somerset. The funding is intended to support a wide range of charitable work.
- ▶ **Key Criteria**
- ▶ Charities and other not-for-profit organisations can apply as long as they are wholly based and working in the South West of England, particularly Devon, Cornwall and parts of Somerset. There is a preference for Exeter and East Devon. Preference is given to smaller local charities who have limited resources for fundraising. National charities must be able to show how their work will benefit those in the South West of England. The funding is for charitable purposes.
- ▶ **Restrictions**
- ▶ Funding is not available for the following: Individuals. Any organisation using live animals for experimentation or research purposes. Projects of a religious nature. Maintenance or repair of religious buildings. Projects outside the UK. Applications from North Somerset, Bristol and Avon are very unlikely to be successful.
- ▶ **Application Procedure**
- ▶ Guidelines and an online application form can be found on the Norman Family Charitable Trust website. Applications for less than £5,000 will be considered every six to eight weeks. Applications for over £5,000 will be considered at quarterly meetings (March, June, September and December). Contact the Norman Family Charitable Trust for further information. **From April 2020, we have introduced a new online application form which will enable applicants to apply and attach supporting documents online, without the need to post anything to the Trust. The online form asks the same questions as before so you can use the current form to prepare the longer responses if that's helpful.
