The AZAB (Azores and Back) is a Category 1 ocean yacht race with each of the two legs being 1,170 nautical miles even if the rhumb line can be sailed! The Azores and Back Race was created in response to the desire for an ocean race which started and finished in the UK, a wish that was taken up by the RCYC's Colin Drummond in 1975 and has been run every four years since. The race is for all comers, from experienced racers sailing high-performance boats to local cruisers in need of a challenge.

THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

The National Maritime Museum Cornwall has a range of exciting exhibitions and events planned throughout the year. They also host a Lecture Series with an array of speakers. The subjects covered are varied but all have a maritime or Cornish connection. In 2023 speakers include the illustrator Matt Johnson who will talk about his new book Red Sails & Pilchards, Plymouth University's Dr Elaine Murphy who explores female pirates and the experience of women at sea, Dr Jo Esra from the University of Exeter who discusses a group of 17th century pirates who became notorious for taking people rather than goods and Dr Richard Blakeman from the University of Reading who uncovers the myths and realities in the history of pirates.
